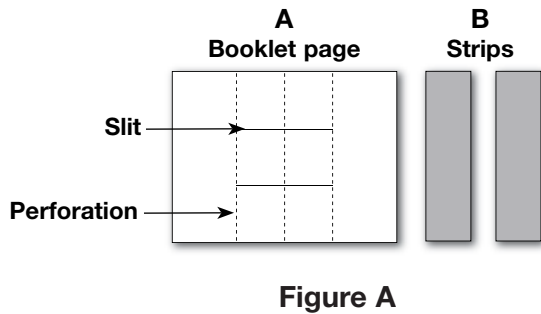

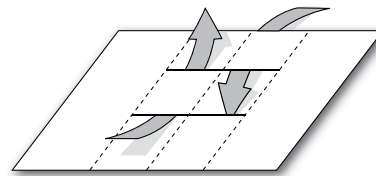

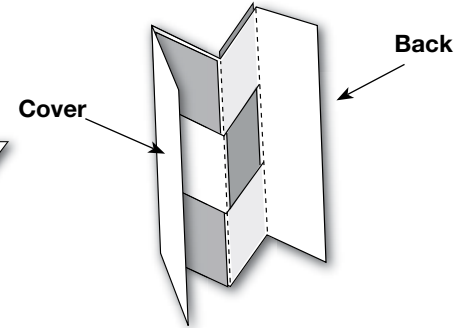

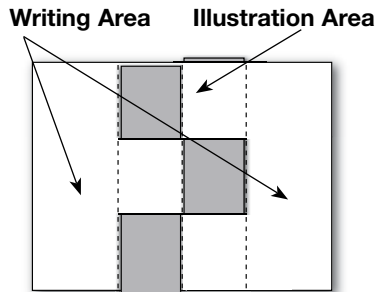
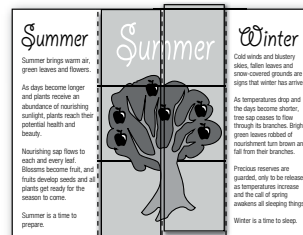

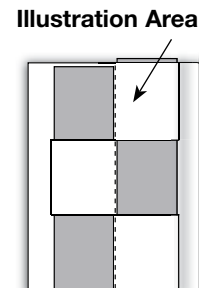

The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.

1. Die-cut Booklet, Woven dies A and B from cardstock or other paper (Figure A).
 2. Lay the Booklet page lengthwise, so the slits are running horizontally and the perforated lines run vertically. Weave one of the strips so it goes OVER the first piece of the Booklet page, UNDER the center section and OVER the third section. Push this to one side (Figure B).
 3. Weave the second strip so it goes UNDER the first piece of the Booklet page, OVER the center and UNDER the third section, filling in the remaining side (Figure B).
 4. Fold the Woven Booklet, creating a cover and a back, with the woven pages in the center (Figure C).
 5. Pull the cover and the back in opposite directions to create full-page areas for writing on both sides of the Booklet. Use the woven center for the first illustration (Figure D).
 6. Re-fold the Booklet. Reach inside between the two woven strips to separate them, and open to reveal the hidden second illustration area (Figure E).
