

Puppet, Finger Puppet Pig

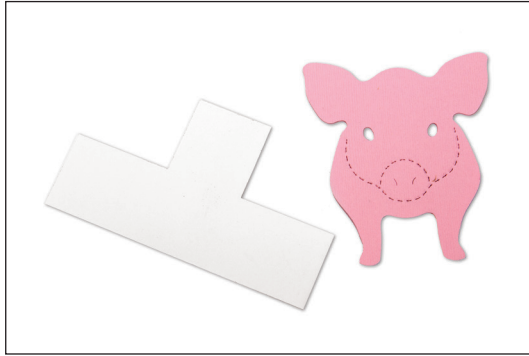

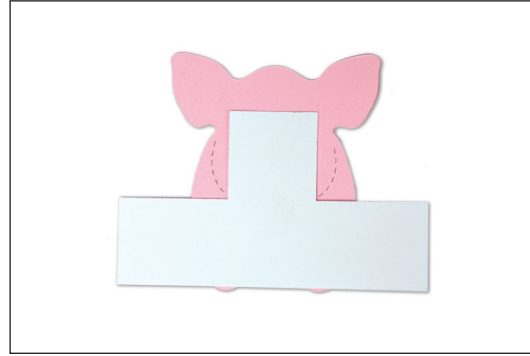

The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.

1. Die-cut the puppet pieces from colored paper (Figure A).
2. Add details to the pig by layering with other colors or coloring with a crayon or marker. The eyes can be colored by placing a scrap of black paper behind the eye holes (Figure C).
3. Attach the pig to the finger puppet base (Figure B). Curl the ends around, overlap and secure them together with adhesive, tape or a stapler (Figure C).
4. Students need to slide only a couple of fingers into the opening in order to play with their finger puppets.
5. The teacher can die-cut multiple bases and allow students to create more finger puppets of their own design.

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
