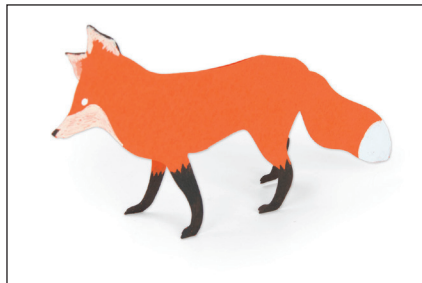

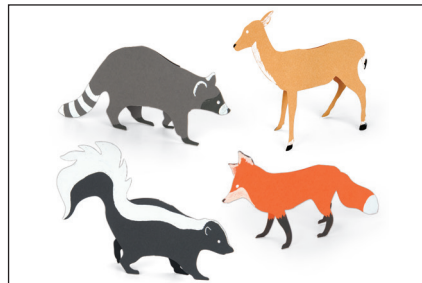

The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.

1. Die-cut the Fox, and add detail with colored paper or colored pens on both sides of the die-cut (Figure A).
2. Fold along the middle of the Fox (aligning the tabs), and then fold along the tabs (Figure B).
3. Interlock the slits in the tabs to allow the Fox to stand up (Figures B & C).
4. Additional 3-D animal dies are available (Figure D).

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
